Monthly Impact Report — June 2026

This report presents the activities, reach, and measurable outcomes of The Noemara Elara Foundation for June 2026. Covering **Project Awaaz Bharat** and **Project Viksit Bharat**, it documents student enrolment, learning outcomes, volunteer contributions, partner growth, and special initiatives — providing stakeholders with a transparent account of the Foundation's impact.

June 2026 — Impact at a Glance

June 2026 was a significant month for the Foundation. Two flagship programs delivered structured interventions across multiple partner sites, while new partnerships and volunteer engagement strengthened our operational capacity.

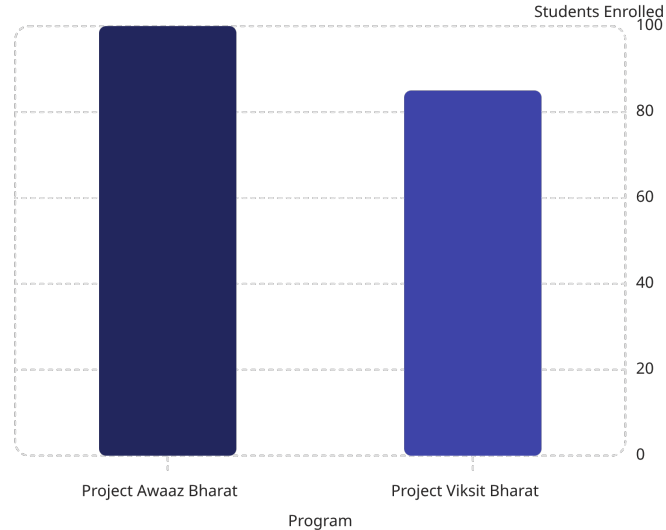

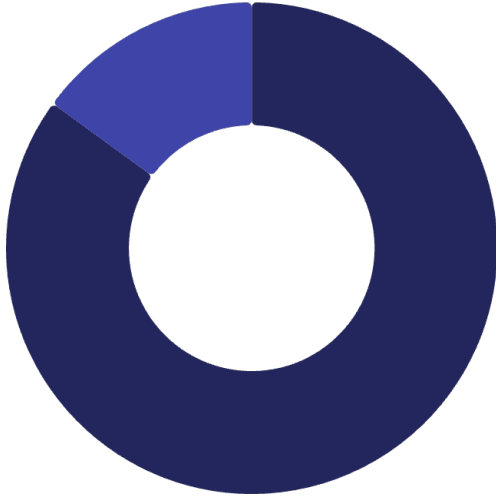

Awaaz Bharat — Enrollment & Participation

Project Awaaz Bharat focuses on building communication, confidence, and civic awareness among students from underserved communities. In June 2026, the program engaged **100 students** across multiple partner NGO locations, with structured sessions in public speaking, debate, Model United Nations, and social awareness.



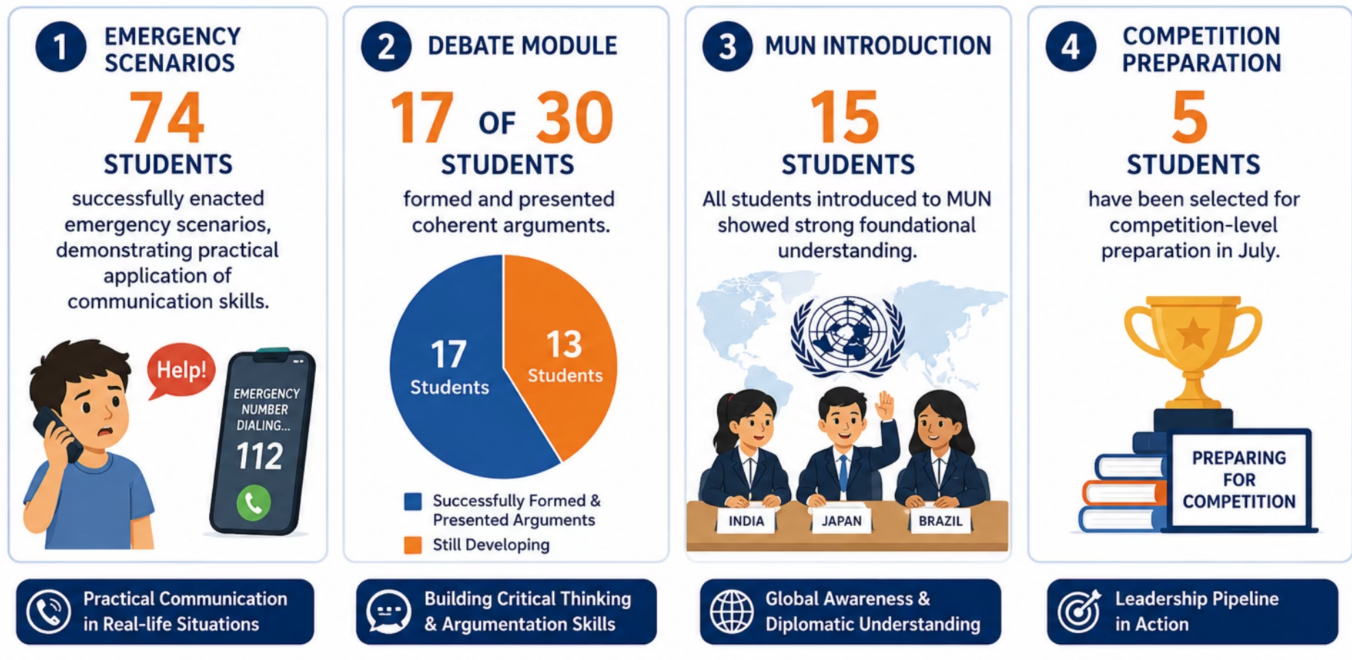
Confidence Building Outcomes

Of the 100 students enrolled, **85 demonstrated measurable improvement in confidence levels** — a core objective of the program. Confidence was assessed through participation, willingness to speak publicly, and engagement in scenario-based activities.

- 85 students showed improved confidence
- 15 students are in early stages of engagement
- Improvement tracked through facilitator observations

Awaaz Bharat – Skills & Learning Outcomes

Beyond confidence-building, Awaaz Bharat delivered targeted skill modules in emergency preparedness, debate, and Model United Nations. The chart below illustrates student participation and achievement rates across each module.



74 students successfully enacted emergency scenarios, demonstrating practical application of communication skills. In the debate module, **17 of 30 students** formed and presented coherent arguments. All 15 students introduced to MUN showed strong foundational understanding, and **5 students** have been selected for competition-level preparation in July.

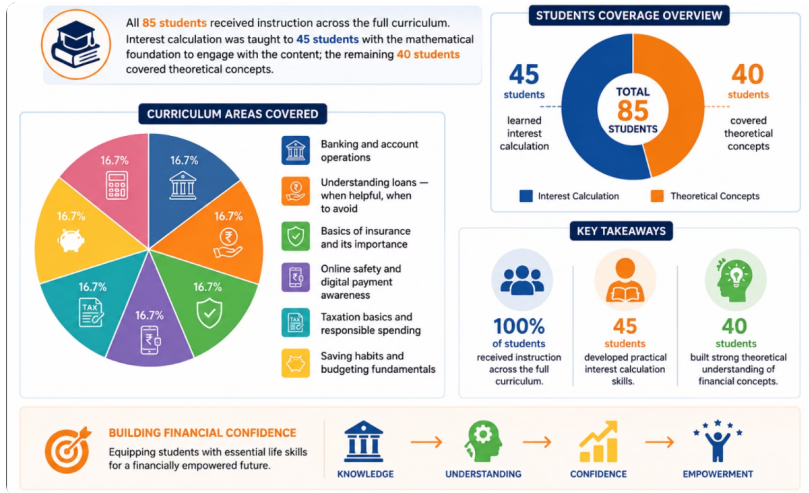

Viksit Bharat – Enrollment & Curriculum Coverage

Project Viksit Bharat equips students with practical financial literacy and life skills. In June 2026, **85 students** participated in the program, covering a comprehensive curriculum designed to build real-world financial understanding.



Curriculum Breakdown

All 85 students received instruction across the full curriculum. Interest calculation was taught to 45 students with the mathematical foundation to engage with the content; the remaining 40 students covered theoretical concepts.

- Banking and account operations
- Understanding loans – when helpful, when to avoid
- Basics of insurance and its importance
- Online safety and digital payment awareness
- Taxation basics and responsible spending
- Saving habits and budgeting fundamentals

Viksit Bharat – Assessment Results & High Achievers

A one-month final assessment was conducted for **40 students** who had completed the full module content. The results reflect a strong grasp of financial literacy concepts across the cohort, with several exceptional performers standing out.

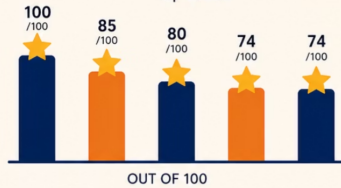

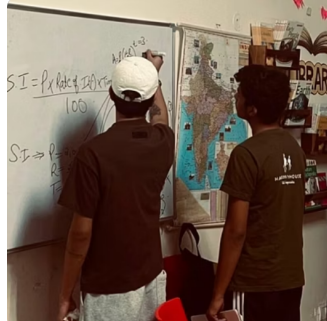


Three students demonstrated such exceptional understanding that they were introduced to concepts typically taught in **Class XI Economics** – including advanced topics in microeconomics and fiscal policy – well beyond the standard curriculum.

Students demonstrated applied understanding of insurance, loans, and budgeting through structured role plays – an interactive method that reinforces learning through practical simulation of real-life financial decisions.

Special Initiative — Hands-On STEM Workshop

In addition to our core programs, the Foundation conducted a **hands-on STEM workshop** for 50 children. Using waste materials — plastic bottles, straws, and cardboard — students designed and built their own working car models, fostering creativity, critical thinking, and environmental awareness.



Workshop Highlights

- **50 students** participated in the hands-on workshop
- Materials used: plastic bottles, straws, and cardboard
- Students designed and built working car models
- Top 3 teams awarded certificates for innovation and critical thinking
- Activity promoted sustainability, engineering thinking, and teamwork



The top 3 teams were recognized with Certificates of Innovation for their outstanding designs and problem-solving approach.

Volunteer Contributions & Partner Growth

The Foundation's impact in June 2026 was made possible by a dedicated volunteer team and a growing network of partner organizations. This section summarizes volunteer engagement and partnership expansion during the month.

Volunteer Hours — June 2026

The volunteer team contributed a **collective 44 hours** in June. The core team of 5 volunteers each contributed approximately 14 hours, while 7 extended team members contributed the remaining hours — totaling **280 individual volunteer hours** when each volunteer's contribution is counted separately.

New NGO partnerships expanded program reach to additional communities and student groups.

Two school partnerships were formalized, enabling structured program delivery within formal education settings.

These five new partnerships strengthen the Foundation's ability to scale both Project Awaaz Bharat and Project Viksit Bharat in the coming months.
